



While not intending division, Luther's articulate objections to indulgences and forceful questioning of the Pope's authority sparked an explosion, now known as the Protestant Reformation.

The Reformation began as protest, but grew because it was fueled by biblical truth. Most significantly was Luther's summary of the Apostle Paul's teaching on salvation by "justification by faith alone."

Tomorrow, October 31, we celebrate 499 years of Reformation. Enjoy Luther's own words of discovery and delight as you remember Reformation Day ~

St. Paul teaches the right way to be virtuous and to be saved; he says that all are sinners, unable to glory in God. All must, however, be justified through faith in Christ, who has merited this for us by his blood and has become for us a mercy seat in the presence of God, who forgives us all our previous sins. In so doing, God proves that it is his justice alone, which he gives through faith, that helps us, the justice which was at the appointed time revealed through the Gospel and previously, was witnessed to by the Law and the Prophets... Even as Abraham's circumcision was an outward sign with which he proved his justice based on faith, so too all good works are only outward signs which flow from faith and are the fruits of faith; they prove that the person is already inwardly just in the sight of God.
